Past Simple: affirmatives

We use the Past Simple to talk about activities and events that happened in the past. We often say when they happened:

My dad **climbed** in the Himalayas in 1988.

I **had** eggs for breakfast.

SPELLING RULES – PAST SIMPLE FORM

Regular verbs

- general rule: infinitive + -ed, e.g. work – worked
- verbs ending in -e: + -d, e.g. like – liked
- verbs ending in a vowel + a consonant: double the consonant + -ed, e.g. stop – stopped
- verbs ending in a consonant + -y: ~~y~~ + -ied, e.g. cry – cried
