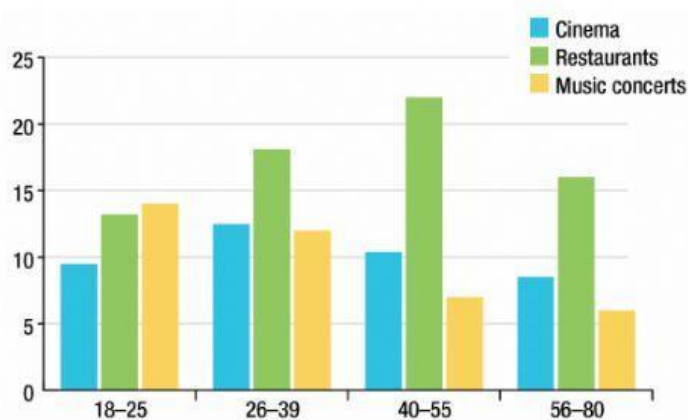


Unit 3: Exercise 4

The bar chart compares the amount of money (in millions of dollars) that people in four different age groups from Seoul, South Korea, spent on going to the cinema, restaurants and music concerts in 2014.

Read the information. Then read the sentences about the chart and match them with the correct main features. Use the words in the box.

- 1 The 26–39 age group spent the most money on going to the cinema while the 56–80s spent the least money.
- 2 The 40–55 and 56–80 age groups spent almost the same amount of money on music concerts, at about \$7 million.

Overall, the most amount of money was spent on going to restaurants (about \$67 million), compared with going to the cinema (about \$40 million) and music concerts (also about \$40 million).
