Tasks 2 - 3: READING COMPREHENSION

Read the text about James Cook, a famous sailor and explorer.

“I don’t intend to go farther than any man has been before me, but as far as I think it is possible for a man to go.” said Captain James Cook.

1 Captain Cook was a modest man, lively in conversation, sensible and intelligent. In temper he was somewhat impulsive, but friendly, kind and compassionate. He was quite tall, good-looking, with a face full of expression and piercing brown eyes. Although he was quite a handsome and capable man, he was plain both in dress and attitude. Most of all, James Cook was strict, formal and serious, a real seaman and cartographer whose maps are used even today.

2 James Cook was born on 7 November 1728 in Yorkshire. In 1745, when he was 16, Cook moved to the coast, to a fishing village that made him feel the lure of the sea, and soon to a nearby port town, where he became a merchant navy apprentice in a fleet which transported coal along the English coast. During his three-year apprenticeship, Cook, as a seaman-to-be, studied algebra, geometry, trigonometry, navigation and astronomy in order to be able to take all the necessary examinations. In 1752, he became shipmate. Shortly after this he volunteered in the Royal Navy during the Seven Years’ War, a global Anglo-French war which spread over five continents. During the war, Cook demonstrated great talent for surveying and cartography, as well as astronomical observations while mapping coastlines. Cook then realized that his career could grow better and faster in the military service. Thus, after not more than 2 years, Cook passed his master’s examination and became qualified to navigate and handle ships of the Royal Navy.

3 During the rest of his life, Cook made three famous voyages. His first and most famous voyage started in 1768. The expedition departed from England, rounded Cape Horn and went to Tahiti. He sailed further to the South Pacific, all around New Zealand through the Polynesian islands and mapped the whole coastline. In 1770, Cook reached the south-eastern coast of Australia and was the first European ever to meet an Aboriginal tribe. He mapped most of the Australian eastern coastline. He returned to England in 1771, after claiming possession of the Australian land on behalf of the British Crown. The second voyage started in 1772, when Cook led another expedition for the Royal Society to look for the ‘Unknown Southern Land’, what today we call Antarctica. Cook sailed around the Antarctic Circle in 1773 and wasn’t even aware that there was land there! Cook did not find the mythical land due to severe ice conditions so he returned to England. Not empty handed though: he made maps of the whole of the Southern Pacific Ocean.

4 On his last voyage, which started in 1776, Cook wanted to find a route from the Pacific to the Atlantic Ocean round the top of North America. On his way he found the Hawaiian Islands, explored the west coast of North America, including Alaska, and mapped the area accurately. Cook returned to Hawaii, where he was somewhat worshipped due to the fact that the islanders believed Cook to be *Lono*, their god of agriculture and fertility. However, there was turmoil on the island, and Cook was accidentally killed by one of the Hawaiian King’s men in 1779.


