

PAST SIMPLE VS PAST SIMPLE CONTINUOUS

PAST SIMPLE	PAST SIMPLE CONTINUOUS
- We use past simple to narrate events in a story in the past - The auxiliary verb for negative and questions is DID.	- We use the past simple continuous to describe situations in a story - The auxiliary verb for negative and interrogative sentence is the verb TO BE in past form - WAS/WERE
Examples	Examples
- You went to Japan last year Did you go to Japan last year? - You didn't go to Japan last year.	- He was waiting for a bus at the airport Was he waiting for a bus at the airport? - He wasn't waiting for a bus at the airport.

PAST SIMPLE STRUCTURE

AFFIRMATIVE

Subject + past TO BE + verb -ing + object

I was playing tennis yesterday

He/she/it was playing tennis

We/you/they were playing tennis

NEGATIVE

Subject + past TO BE + not + verb -ing + object

I was not playing tennis yesterday

He/she/it was not playing tennis.

We/you/they were not playing tennis

INTERROGATIVE

Past TO BE + Subject + verb -ing + object?

Was I playing tennis yesterday?

Was he/she/it playing tennis?

Were we/you/they playing tennis yesterday?
