



Mixed conditionals



Tanya became a teacher 10 years ago.

As a teacher she wanted to work in the USA but her first job took her to Berlin where she met her husband. Now they live in Berlin together.

If she hadn't become a teacher, she would have never met her husband.

If she hadn't met her husband, she wouldn't live in Berlin today.

If she hadn't married her husband, she would have already left Berlin.

If she had left Berlin, she would live in the USA now.
