"LIKES & DISLIKES +ING"

Like/Love/Hate/Not **Mind/**Can´t stand + **ing**. The verbs **love**, **like**, enjoy, **dislike**, not **mind**, can´t stand and **hate** are verbs which express likes and dislikes. They are usually followed by a gerund (verb + -ing) when the meaning is general.









NOT MIND - DON'T MIND (I/you/we/they) or DOESN'T MIND (he/she) Significado: me da lo mismo o no me importa.

I like getting up early in the summer.
