Will vs Be going to vs Present Simple vs Present Continuous

Exercise 1. Will / Be Going to

1. Mark: What are you doing with those scissors?

Beth: I (cut) that picture of the ocean out of the travel magazine.

Mark: What (you, do) with it?

Beth: I (paint) a water colour of the ocean for my art class, and I thought I could use this photograph as a model.

2. Mark: (You, do) me a favour Sam?

Sam: Sure, what do you want me to do?

Mark: I (change) the broken light bulb in the lamp above the dining room table. I need someone to hold the ladder for me while I am up there.

Sam: No problem, I (hold) it for you.

3. Gina: Where are you going?

Ted: I (go) to the store to pick up some groceries.

Gina: What (you, get)?

Ted: I (buy) some milk, some bread, and some coffee.

4. John: Wow, it's freezing out there.

Jane: I (make) some coffee to warm us up. Do you want a piece of pie as well?

John: Coffee sounds great! But I (have) dinner with some friends later, so I'd better skip the pie.

Jane: I (go) to dinner tonight too, but I'm having a piece of pie anyway.

5. Frank: I heard you're taking a Spanish class at the community college.

Tom: Yeah, I (go) to Guatemala next spring and I thought knowing a little Spanish would make the trip easier.

Frank: I (visit) my brother in Marseilles next year. Maybe I should take a French class.

Tom: I have a course catalogue in the other room. I (go) get it, and we can see whether or not they're offering a French course next semester.
