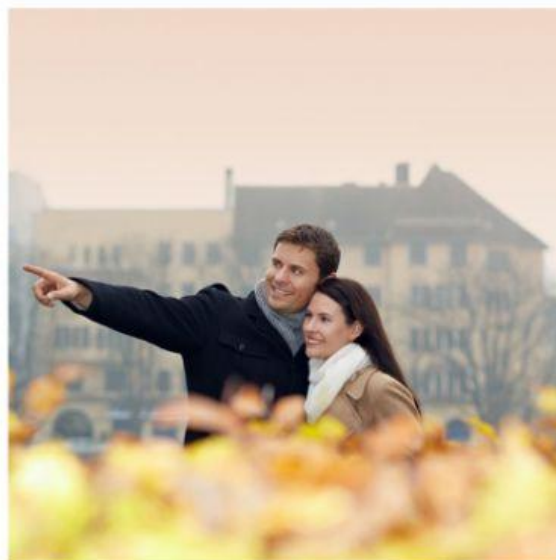

Short answers

Yes, there was. / No, there wasn't. Yes, there were. / No, there weren't.

- We often use *there was / there were* with *a/an, some* and *any*.
- We use *some* and *any* with plural nouns.
- Use *some* in positive (+) sentences, and *any* in negative sentences (-) and questions (?).
- *some* = not an exact number.
