

PARTS OF SPEECH

Nouns, Adjectives and Verbs.

A noun is a naming word. It is a word that names a person, a place or a thing. Examples: boy, school, town, book. If the noun starts with capital letter the noun is a proper noun. USE A BLACK COLOUR to identify nouns. Examples: girl, Mónica, Briviesca.

An adjective is a describing word. It describes how you feel about a thing (ugly, beautiful, funny), the size (big, small...) or the colour (blue, red...). USE A BLUE COLOUR to identify adjectives. Example: This is a red flower.

A verb is a doing word. It tells what a person, an animal or a thing can do. Examples: shine, jump, run, play, fly... USE A RED COLOUR to identify verbs.

Look at the kite!




Tom can play with a ball.




Read these sentences. Underline the adjectives using a blue colour.

Tom plays with a black and white ball.


Read these sentences. Underline the verbs using a red colour.
