FIRST CONDITIONAL - REAL POSSIBILITY

If	Condition	Result
	Present simple	Will/won't + base verb
If	she studies hard,	she will pass the exam.

Result	If	Condition
Will/won't + base verb	Present simple	Present simple
She will pass the exam.	if	she studies hard

We use the first conditional when there is a **real possibility** that this condition will happen in the future. Remember the **s** for the third person singular (present simple).

Example: If it rains, I won't go to the beach
