Hello, kids...

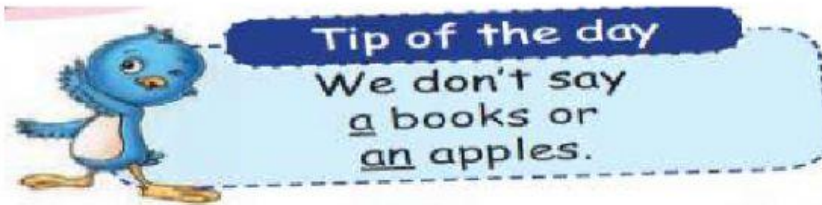
'An' is used with the name of things which start with a vowel sound.

Vowels: a, e, i, o and u (5 letters of English alphabet)

'A' is used with the name of things which start with a consonant sound.

Consonants: b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, y and z (21 letters of English alphabet)

'A' and 'An' are used only with singular(one) countable things.
