simple present *Wh-* questions

Question	Auxiliary	Subject	Verb	
<b>What</b>	<b>do</b>	<b>you</b>	<b>have</b> for breakfast?	Coffee and toast.
<b>When</b>	<b>do</b>	<b>they</b>	<b>have</b> breakfast?	At 8:00.
<b>Where</b>	<b>do</b>	<b>they</b>	<b>have</b> breakfast?	In a cafe.
<b>Who</b>	<b>do</b>	<b>you</b>	<b>have</b> breakfast with?	Our children.
<b>How</b>	<b>do</b>	<b>they</b>	<b>go</b> to work?	By bus.

- Simple present +, -, and ? is the same for *I, you, we, you (plural), and they*.

- Simple present *Wh-* questions ask for information. They don't take *yes* or *no* answers.
- Common question words are *who, what, where, when, why, and how*.



### Word order in questions

+ You have breakfast.  
yes / no ? **Do** you have breakfast?  
Wh- ? **Where** do you have breakfast?
