

Wh-words 1

a) **Read** these class notes and examples **carefully**:

WHO refers to **PEOPLE**:

Matthew and Arnold are playing the piano.
Who is playing the piano?

I am phoning your teacher.
Who are you phoning?

WHAT refers to **THINGS**:

This is a gold watch.
What is that?

She has got a calendar on her desk.
What has she got on her desk?

WHICH refers to **OPTIONS**:

The correct answer is D).
Which is the correct answer?

I can buy the white wine. (answer: the white one)
Which wine can you buy?

WHERE refers to **PLACES**:

I am from France.
Where are you from?

My father is at the factory.

Where is your father?

WHEN refers to **GENERAL TIME**:

My friends are coming on Tuesday.
When are your friends coming?

My guitar lesson is this evening.
When is your guitar lesson?

WHAT TIME refers to a **PRECISE TIME**:

The next train is at half past six.
What time is the next train?

The football match is at a quarter past seven.
What time is the (football) match?

WHY refers to the **REASON** or **CAUSE**:

He was late because he missed his train.
Why was he late?

I can't eat this because it has too much salt.
Why can't you eat this?

WHOSE refers to **PEOPLE'S POSSESSIONS** or relatives:

This is Mary's car.
Whose is this car?

Harry's brother had an accident yesterday.
Whose brother had an accident yesterday?

HOW refers to **MANNER**:

He is coming by train.
How is he coming?

You must cook these vegetables **over a low fire**.
How must I cook these vegetables?

HOW MANY refers to **A NUMBER**:

I've got **three** cousins.
How many cousins have you got?

There are **twenty** chocolates in these boxes.
How many chocolates are there in those boxes?

HOW MUCH refers to **AN AMOUNT** or **MONEY**:

This dress is **fifty pounds ninety-nine**.
How much is that dress?

There is **half a litre** of wine in this bottle.
How much wine is there in that bottle?

HOW + adjective or adverb can refer to **age, frequency, distance, speed,...**

He is **five** years old.
How old is he?

We visit our grandparents **every week**.
How often do you visit your grandparents?

We are **30 miles** from London.
How far are we from London?

He was driving **at 90 mph**. (mph = miles per hour)
How fast was he driving?
