FUTURE SIMPLE: WILL

will: prediction



We use **will** to talk about a future event, something that we think or predict will happen.
We usually use the contraction **won't** (**will not**) for a negative prediction.
After **will** / **won't** we use the infinitive without **to**.

Will for prediction (affirmative and negative)

I / You / He / She
We / They

✓ will

✗ won't

be successful.
live in a flat.
enjoy your job.
