A lot of waste is recycled in the US – about 87 million tons each year. Plastic and paper thrown in those special blue bins are collected to become environmentally friendly products. So we can say that recycling is a business in the US!

Everything that is collected is separated and packed up. Then it is sent to areas where it is processed. Paper, for example, is processed at a mill and turned into pulp that is then repurposed. Most of the goods recycled in the US are sold to China.

Unfortunately, because of contamination, 1 out of 4 items in a recycling bin are thrown away. Contamination happens when paper or plastic goes into the trash with food remnants, which messes up the refining process and, therefore, cannot be reused.
