# SUPER CIRCUSES



When someone says the word 'circus', we might think of tigers and elephants performing tricks in the ring. But if you visit Cirque Italia Water Circus, you don't see animals of any kind. Aquatic Spectacular is a show with an international all-human cast. Artists perform dazzling feats in, on and around a huge tank holding 35,000 gallons of water. They do tightrope-walking and hand-balancing, twist their bodies into amazing positions and juggle with laser beams. The circus's creator, Manuel Rebecchi, wanted to do something modern and different. He was drinking a glass of water when he suddenly thought of a water theme – and Aquatic Spectacular was born.

## Phare, the Cambodian Circus

Phare is another circus that doesn't use animals. Instead, fifteen young Cambodian artists tell wonderful stories from their culture – modern and traditional – but not in words. Performances are a mixture of theatre, music, dance, juggling, mime and acrobatics. What makes this circus special is the Ponleu Selpak training programme which the circus offers. Talented youngsters from poor families and homes with problems can take lessons in performing arts before going on to perform at the circus. This helps them get jobs in the arts and even become successful abroad. It also helps keep Cambodian culture alive. And for every circus ticket sold, 75% of the money goes towards the training programme. If you love learning about Asian culture and art, then Phare Circus in Cambodia is well worth visiting.
