



1. Plan your journey. For journeys beyond 2 hours a second driver is recommended. If you are tired, sleepy, drunk or in an emotional state, postpone your journey.

3. Give signals and observe all safety rules when changing lanes, by checking side mirrors and rearview mirrors before executing this potentially dangerous traffic maneuver.

5. Avoid tailgating at all times as it is the main cause of many serious accidents.
6. Observe safety guidelines when overtaking. Never overtake when in doubt.
7. Don't jump queue or abuse the usage of emergency lanes as it is not only very rude but also very dangerous.
8. Avoid weaving through traffic as it can jeopardize your safety and that of other road users.
