The last person who heard a veterans account of General Custer's last stand was Joseph Medicine Crow-High Bird who died in April 3, 2016.

There are also so many war atrocities caused in WW2. The Holocaust was a major one. Another was Japanese \_\_\_\_\_ of POWs (Prisoners of war) including ..... TREAT the Baatan Death March. As victory for the United States \_\_\_\_\_ approached, ..... SLOW President Harry Truman gave the order to drop the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima on 6 August 1945, hoping that the \_\_\_\_\_ of the city would break Japanese ..... DESTROY resolve and end the war. A second bomb was \_\_\_\_\_ on Nagasaki on 9 August after it ..... DROP appeared that the Japanese high command was not planning to surrender. Approximately 140,000 people died in Hiroshima from the bomb and its aftereffects by the end of 1945, and approximately 74,000 in Nagasaki.
