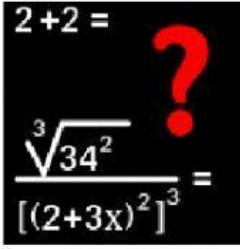


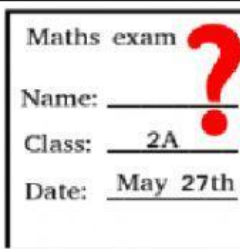

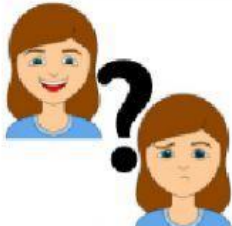
a) Write the wh-word that each picture represents:

b) Remember how we ask a wh-question **when there is no auxiliary in the affirmative sentence:** ?

In the present simple and the past simple there are no auxiliaries:	I have breakfast <u>in the kitchen.</u> He gets up <u>at seven.</u> She travelled <u>by bus.</u>
1. Choose the correct wh-word →	→ Where? <u>In the kitchen.</u> → What time? <u>At seven.</u> → How? <u>By bus.</u>
2. Use DO / DOES for the present simple, or DID for the past. (Click on the auxiliaries to watch some videotutorials in Spanish.)	... do you have ...? ... does he get up ...? ... did she travel ...? IMPORTANT: write the main verb in the infinitive: no -s, no -ed.
3. Use this word order: wh-word + Aux + S	Where do you have breakfast? What time does he get up? How did she travel?
Exception: <u>wh-word</u> + (Aux) + V S	<u>John</u> cooked dinner today. ↓ ↓ Who cooked dinner today?
