

Form Present Simple

S + verb + object ...

I/we/they/you + like + tea.
He/she/it + likes + tea.

Use it
for ...

- * Facts.
- * Habitual actions.
- * Things that don't/won't change.
- * Describing yourself.



S + don't/doesn't + verb + object ...

I + don't + like + tea.
She + doesn't + like + tea.

Signal
words

Adverbs of frequency, like:

- * Often
- * Usually
- * Sometimes
- * Never

Do/Does + S + verb + object?

Do + you/we/they/I + like + tea?
Does + he/she/it + like + tea?

BUT REMEMBER



*** The verb 'to be' is different ***
I + am (Australian.)
He/she/it + is (clever.)
you/we/they + are (nice.)

The verb changes
in 3rd person singular
(he, she, it).

We add -s
run - runs eat - eats

Add -es when the
verb ends in

-ss -sh -ch -x -z or -o
fix - fixes go - goes
wash - washes

When the verb ends in
consonant + y

cry - cries
study - studies
dry - dries

tidy - tidies
fly - flies
copy - copies

SIMPLE PRESENT TENSE SENTENCE PATTERN

Positive sentence(+) : Cika makes a valentine parcel

Negative sentence(-) : Cika doesn't make a valentine parcel

Interrogative sentence(?) : Does Cika make a valentine parcel?

Using Question word : What does Cika make?

Answer : She makes a valentine parcel.
