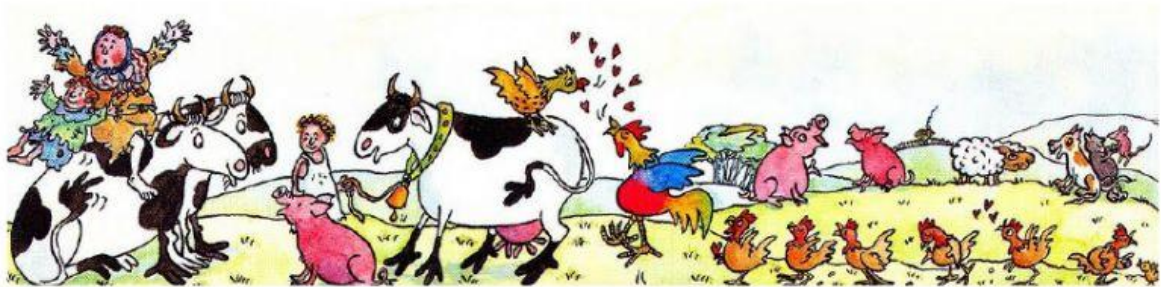

CHANTICLEER AND THE FOX

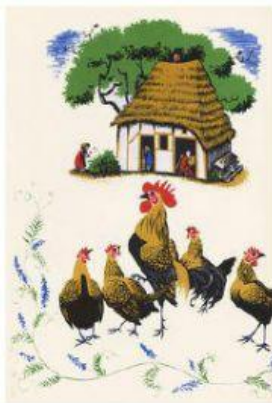
Read the short story. Then choose the correct answers.
