## Vowel Digraphs ie and ei and Vowel Pair ei

TIP: The vowels ie and ei can be vowel pairs as well as vowel digraphs. Vowel pair ei can spell the long e sound, as in the word deceit. The vowel digraph ie can also spell the long e sound (believe). Vowel digraph ei can spell the long a sound (freight). Here's a helpful rule: "I before E, except after C,

Or when ei sounds like A,

As in eighty and freight"

The words either and neither are tricky!

They do not follow this rule.
