Among all the verbs, we use, 'go' is one of the most commonly used.

However, repetition makes our texts look poor.

In the following slide, we will look at synonyms of 'go' in order to avoid these repetitions.



2. SYNONYMS FOR 'GO'

Go fast = hurry / rush / race (I hurried to clean my bedroom)

Go by car = drive (My father drove me to...)

Go on foot = walk (We were walking to school when...)

Go closer = approach (He approached the dog carefully)

Go out of / go away= leave / depart / head out

Go to = set out for / head for / make one's way

Go online = get online, access the internet

Go to school (classes)= attend school

Go to live = move

Go home = walk home, drive home, get home, head home, return home, get back home
