Время Present Simple (настоящее простое) используется для описания повседневных и повторяющихся действий.

Для образования утвердительных предложений в Present Simple для местоимений *he, she, it* к глаголу-сказуемому добавляется окончание -s.

He **eats** fruit for lunch.

Для образования **отрицания** в Present Simple для местоимений *he, she, it* используется вспомогательный глагол *does + not (doesn't)* – сокращение, при этом окончание -s глагола опускается.

He **doesn't** have tea for lunch.

Для образования **вопросительных предложений (?)** в Present Simple для местоимений *he, she, it* используется вспомогательный глагол *does*, который выносится перед подлежащим, при этом окончание -s глагола опускается.

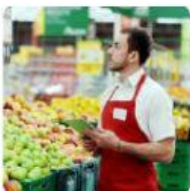

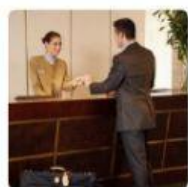
