Gold Rush

From 1849 to 1899 thousands of prospectors chased dreams of riches from the gold fields of Cal-

ifornia. Newspapers published reports from the American River in California that gold was being "collected at random and without any trouble." By 1852 the stampede for the precious ore (49) ____ the state's population nearly twentyfold. When California's surface gold gave out, prospectors (50) ____ by the gold bug rushed to the Comstock Lode in the Sierra Nevada. But these fabulous stores of gold and silver were rich (51) ____ diggings – too (52) ____ embedded to mine

without plenty of capital. Over the next 20 years, rumors of gold and silver strikes lured fortune hunters to the Black Hills of the Dakota Territory and to Pikes Peak and Leadville, Colorado. This led to head for "the golden Mecca of the North", in Alaska, the last and one of the greatest gold rushes.
