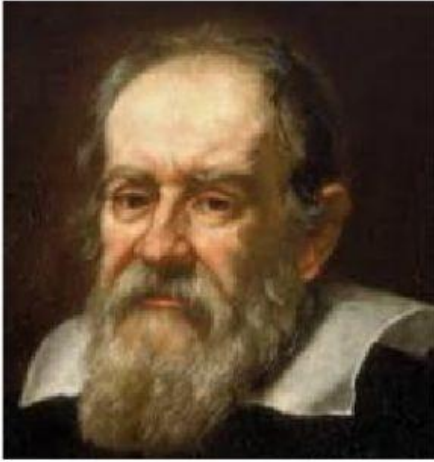


Galileo Galilei

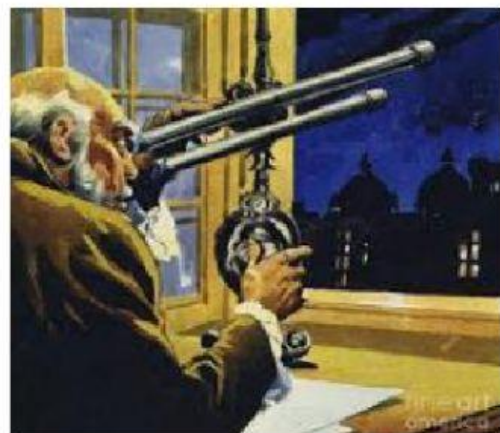

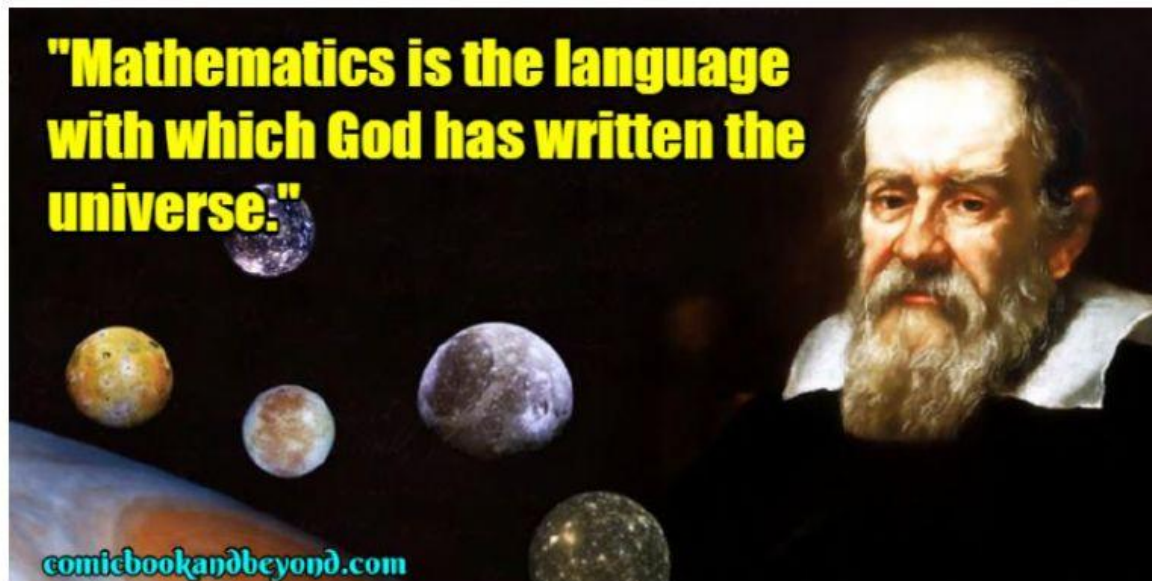
