Back then, there were only a few tailor shops in town to make new clothes and it was expensive to make one. So their mother bought some materials and sewed them to make new clothes for everyone. Each of them had a pair of new clothes for Hari Raya every year with new songkoks.	  <b>Use sequence markers</b>
3	Then, they gathered together in the mosque early in the morning to perform Hari Raya prayers. The mosque was filled with other Muslims and other residents of the Kampong Ayer. Most of them wore new clothes at the mosque on that day. It is a colourful sight.	  <b>Information organized in paragraphs</b>
4 5	After prayers, they went home and before breakfast they asked for forgiveness from their parents. The day was spent by visiting relatives and friends while indulging in extravagant meals. There were plenty of traditional Malay delicacies unlike the modern cakes and biscuits served today.	
6	The most exciting moment for them were when they were given gifts in the form of money normally coins and not paper notes. Their friends and children often look forward to getting this money on Hari Raya. There were not put in green packets like today. Today the gifts are put inside a packet usually green in colour with paper notes in them.	
<b>Conclusion</b>	Sometimes they miss how they used to celebrate Hari Raya. Overall, Hari Raya will always be a joyous occasion for them and me.
