Word Work says... We usually add **-s** to a noun to make a plural. For example, two camels, three gorillas, four leopards.

When nouns end in a consonant and **-y**, the **-y** changes into an **-i** and we add **-es**. For example, three **cities**, two **countries**, four **butterflies**.

When a noun ends in **-x**, **-ch**, **-s** or **-ss**, we add **-es**. For example, two **foxes**, three **witches**, five **buses**, two **dresses**.

Some nouns have irregular plurals. Look:
