The Mayflower

The Mayflower was the ship which transported the Pilgrims from Plymouth, England, to Massachusetts, which later became part of the United States of America.

The ship left Plymouth on September 16, 1620. After a gruelling 66-day journey the ship's crew sighted land near Cape Cod. Some time was spent selecting a suitable place for the colony, and on December 26 the Pilgrims landed at a place 1..... Plymouth in memory of the port in England where their journey 2.....

It is known that the Mayflower was originally used as a cargo ship which was sailed between England and other European countries. The captain of the vessel during 3..... was Christopher Jones. After landing he and the Mayflower stayed with the Pilgrims in America 4..... Half of the crew died during that first winter.

The Mayflower left Plymouth after the winter was over, and arrived back in England in May 1621. Christopher Jones took the Mayflower on another trading run to France later that year, but 5....., in May 1622. He was buried at St Mary's Cathedral in Rotherhithe, Surrey, England.

After the death of Christopher Jones, the owners of the Mayflower stopped using the ship and by May 1624 it 6..... Because of its very poor condition it was almost certainly broken up and sold off as scrap lumber.

In 1957 a group of British businessmen 7..... of a replica of the original Mayflower from Plymouth, England, to Plymouth, Massachusetts. The vessel, Mayflower II, was given to the United States as an expression of international goodwill and remains on exhibit in Plymouth, Massachusetts.
