

What does each criterion refer to? – Match the criterion with the definition

Criterion 1: Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The text includes all the required content.
Criterion 2: Communicative achievement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The communicative purpose (Ex. sharing information about a friend) is reasonably achieved. The text is understood by the reader. Very few parts are difficult to follow.
Criterion 3: Organization 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The ideas mostly follow a logical sequence.
Criterion 3: Organization 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Includes the correct structure of the text almost fully. Connectors and phrases are used effectively.
Criterion 4: Use of English 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The sentences use the required vocabulary from the unit.
Criterion 4: Use of English 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Most of the grammar structures in focus are used correctly.
Criterion 5: Mechanics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are few errors in punctuation, capitalization or spelling.
