- (1) $\frac{1}{2}$ cup rice flour
 - (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups coconut milk
 - (3) $\frac{1}{2}$ cup freshly grated coconut (or $\frac{1}{2}$ cup unsweetened dried coconut flakes moistened with 1-2 tbsp water)
 - (4) 1 tbsp salt
 - (5) 3 pandan leaves (tied in a knot)
- Palem sugar
- (1) 1 pandan leaf
 - (2) $\frac{1}{2}$ cup palm sugar (grated or crumbled)
 - (3) $\frac{1}{4}$ cup water

INSTRUCTIONS

To make palm sugar syrup:

Tear pandan leaf into strips and tie strips together in a knot. In a small saucepan, add pandan leaf, sugar, and $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of water. Simmer for about 5 minutes. Keep stirring until sugar is completely dissolved. Take out pandan leaf and pour syrup through a sieve into a bowl. Set aside to cool.

To make the *bubur* :

- (1) In a mixing bowl, combine the coconut milk, rice flour and $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt. Pour mixture through a sieve to remove lumps.
- (2) Place the mixture in a non-stick saucepan, add pandan leaves and cook the mixture on low heat for about 15-20 mins. While cooking, stir constantly until the mixture thickens and start to boil. Remove from the heat and pour into serving bowls.
- (3) Combine the grated coconut and salt, and mix well.

(4) To serve, top *bubur sumsum* with palm sugar syrup.

Ingredients:

1. 1 tablespoon wheat flour
2. 1 tablespoon sugar
3. 5 g instant yeast
4. 250 g rice flour
5. 125 g sugar
6. 1 egg
7. 500 mL coconut milk
8. Grated cheese for topping

Steps:

1. Firstly, make the main mixture. It is made with wheat flour, sugar, yeast, and water. Mix them together and set it aside for 5 minutes.
2. Mix rice flour, sugar, egg, the main mixture, and 200 mL coconut milk. Stir them until mixed.
3. Add 300 mL coconut milk to the mixture, mix again. Then let it cool for 2 hours.
4. Heat a mold with small fire.
5. Pour 150 mL the mixture into the mold and press.
6. Cook for about 4 minutes and lift.
7. Sprinkle the grated cheese on top, and serve.
