

# Present Perfect

(PRONOUN + HAVE/HAS + PAST PARTICIPLE)

## AFFIRMATIVE

I **have** played = **Yo he jugado**

You **have** played

He **has** played

She **has** played

It **has** played

We **have** played

You **have** played

They **have** played

## NEGATIVE

I **haven't** played = **Yo no he jugado**

You **haven't** played

He **hasn't** played

She **hasn't** played

It **hasn't** played

We **haven't** played

You **haven't** played

They **haven't** played

## INTERROGATIVE

**Have** I played? = **¿He jugado?**

**Have** you played?

**Has** he played?

**Has** she played?

**Has** it played?

**Have** we played?

**Have** you played?

**Have** they played?

3rd Person  
He  
She  
It } **has**

## Answers

**Yes, I have.** / **No, I haven't**

**Yes, she has.** / **No, she hasn't**

# Present Perfect

## regular verbs



+ have, has + Ved/d



+ haven't, hasn't + Ved/d

(WH) have, has + + Ved/d

Ved/d = Past Participle (reg. verbs):

+ -ed/-d at the end of the verb
