

COMPARATIVES

We use comparatives to compare **2** people, places, or things.

SHORT ADJECTIVES

When an adjective is short (1 or 2 syllables) we use **-ER THAN**.

happy → happier than

sad → sadder than



Mary is **happier than** Ann.

Ann is **sadder than** Mary.

LONG ADJECTIVES

When an adjective is long (2+ syllables) we use **MORE - THAN** or **LESS - THAN**.

adorable → more adorable than

dangerous → less dangerous than



The bunny is more adorable than the shark.

The bunny is less dangerous than the shark.

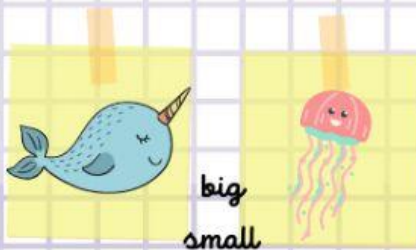
