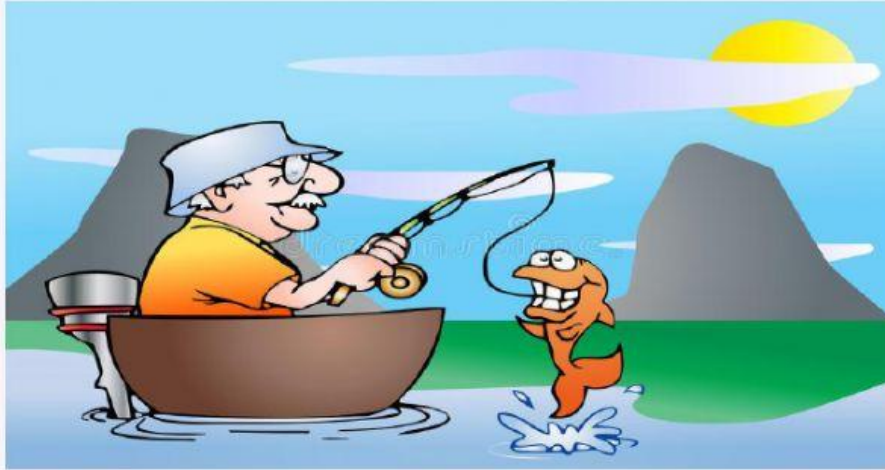


The Golden Fishes
