The Wettest Town in the World: Cilaos, Réunion

Cilaos is the wettest town in the world. It is on the French island of Réunion in the Indian Ocean. Cilaos is in the centre of the island in the mountains. In 1952, Cilaos had the wettest 24 hours ever recorded in the world. Between 15th and 16th March, there were 1,869.9 mm of rainfall.

Average temperatures in Cilaos

The temperatures in Cilaos are from 16 °C to 30 °C. The warmest months are January to March. The temperatures are from 22 °C to 30 °C. There are about 16 rainy days in January. The average rainfall in January is 153 mm. The coldest months are June to August. The temperatures are from 16 °C to 25 °C. On average there are only nine rainy days in May. The average rainfall in May is 39 mm.

Seasons in Cilaos

‘June is the start of the winter,’ says George, ‘and this is my favourite time of year.’ George is a farmer. He grows fruit and sugarcane. He has two children. His daughter Angélique is 15. His son Serge is 14.

George has a dry house in a wet city

‘November is the beginning of the wet season. We can have big storms. These are called cyclones. The wettest months are January and February. The rain is heavy and regular. During the dry winter, I check the house. I fix the roof and get ready for the wet season,’ George says. People in Cilaos like being outside in the dry season. In their free time, they go to the beach. When it is too hot, they go to the mountains to cool down.
