

# Relative Clauses

Relative clauses are used to give more information about a person or a thing. They join two ideas together.

Relative clauses can be joined to the main clause using **who**, **which** or **that**.

We use **which** or **that** when we are talking about things.

**Example:** This is my computer. I use it to study.

**This is my computer which I use to study.**

We use **who** or **that** when we are talking about things.

**Example:** Mr. Bean is a man. He is very funny.

**Mr. Bean is a man who is very funny.**
