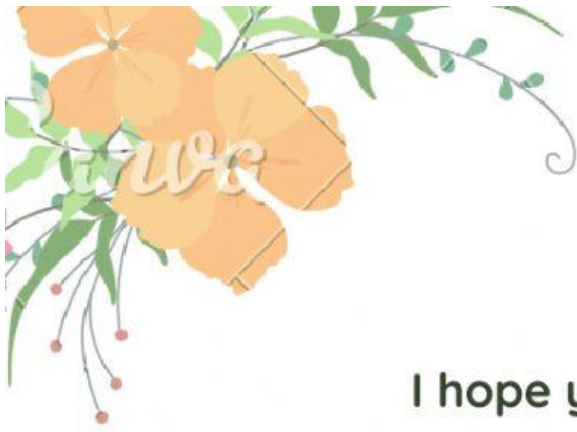

Adjectives with one syllable, add: '-er' or '-r' + 'than'	cold "In Canada, winter is <u>colder</u> <u>than</u> summer."
Adjectives with two syllables that end in '-y', change '-y' to 'i' and add: '-er' + 'than'	hap-py "John is <u>happier</u> <u>than</u> David."
Adjectives with two or more syllables, add: 'more' + 'than'	ex-pen-sive "This book is <u>more</u> expensive <u>than</u> that book."
Adjectives that end in a single vowel and consonant: double the final letter before adding 'than'	big "Russia is <u>bigger</u> <u>than</u> Canada."
Irregular Comparative Adjectives:	good - better than bad - worse than far - farther than further than

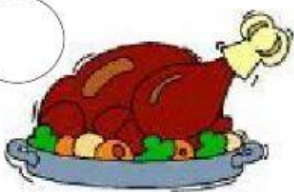
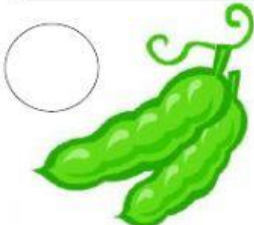
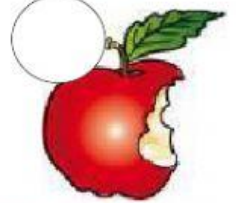

Countable and uncountable nouns

There is / There are



Positive	There is an Apple. There is some milk.	There are apples.
Negative	There isn't an Apple. There isn't any milk.	There aren't apples.
Interrogative	Is there an Apple? Is there any milk?	Are there apples?

Examples:

- There is some sugar.
- There isn't any sugar.
- There are some bananas.
- There aren't any bananas.
- There is an onion.
- There isn't an onion.

- **A/an** + singular countable nouns.

 - There is a banana in the kitchen.
 - There is an orange in the fridge.
- **Some** +

{	Plural countable nouns.
{	Uncountable nouns.



Examples:

- There is some water in the bottle.
- There is some sugar in the kitchen.
- There are some bananas.

- **Any**

{	Countable nouns in questions and negatives.
{	Uncountable nouns in questions.

Examples:

- Are there any oranges in the fridge?
- No, there isn't.
- Is there any coffee in the kitchen?
- No, there isn't any coffee in the kitchen.
