In Britain, young people do exams when they are eighteen which are called <sup>1</sup> \_\_\_\_\_. Some students decide to go to university. If they want to go to Oxford or Cambridge University, they sometimes have to do a(n) <sup>2</sup> \_\_\_\_ exam, but this isn't necessary for most universities. When students first go to university they are known as <sup>3</sup> \_\_\_\_\_. They do a first degree which is called either a BA <sup>4</sup>(\_\_\_\_ of Arts) or a BSc (Bachelor of <sup>5</sup> \_\_\_\_). When they have done the course and passed the <sup>6</sup> \_\_\_\_ examinations, the students are known as <sup>7</sup> \_\_\_\_\_. Some students then do a second degree.
