+	Regular verbs: Subject + VERB + <b>ED</b>	
	Irregular verbs: Subject + VERB (memorize !)	
-	Subject + <b>DIDN'T</b> + VERB (infinitive)	
?	(question words) <b>DID</b> + subject + VERB (infinitive) + ... ?

In affirmative sentences:


- Regular verbs end in -\_\_\_\_\_. If the verb finishes in -E, then we only add -\_\_\_\_\_. Sometimes we double the last consonant.
- The past simple form of irregular verbs is a different word that we must \_\_\_\_\_.

In negative sentences:

- We add \_\_\_\_\_ before the verb. The verb is in the \_\_\_\_\_ form.
- Be careful! The verb BE is different. The negative past forms are \_\_\_\_\_ / \_\_\_\_\_

In questions:

- \_\_\_\_\_ go first. If there isn't a question word, we start with the word \_\_\_\_\_, then we put the \_\_\_\_\_ and then the verb in the \_\_\_\_\_ form. If there is extra information, this goes at the end of the question.



Just add -ED

Verbs ending in -E, →  
just add -D.

When there is a consonant before -Y  
→ change -Y and add -IED

One syllable verbs with consonant +  
vowel + consonant → double the last  
consonant and add - ED

Add -ED to these verbs and put them in the correct group.
