READING TEXT AND TASK**COMMUNICATION IN THE FUTURE:
WHAT IS THERE FOR US?**

About fifty students in two schools in Ha Noi, Viet Nam and Umea, Sweden have been exchanging letters in a penfriend project since 2013. 'I love to write. You can even stick something on the letter, like this tiny sweet!' said Linh, from Ha Noi about the project. From the Sweden end, Anders said, 'It's so nice to open and read real letters!' But will this be our future communication? It's said that in a couple of decades we'll be using telepathy and holography.

Telepathy uses a tiny device placed into our head. Information will be sent and received directly to and from our brains. We'll be communicating just by thought over the **network**! Holography, a video-conference technology with **three-dimensional Images**, will help us **interact in real time** in completely different places.

Impressed? Maybe, but not everyone thinks the **cyberworld** will replace the real world. Like the children in the penfriend project, I prefer to chat with my friends over a cup of tea and **enjoy their company** – life is more meaningful that way!

WHAT DOES THIS TASK ASK YOU TO DO?

This is a common type of question when you do a reading comprehension exercise. 'Context clues' are hints you can find in a sentence, paragraph, or passage that help you understand the meanings of new or unfamiliar words.

It is lucky if you already know the word which is asked, but normally, you are often asked about uncommon or unknown words.

WHAT DO YOU DO IN THIS TASK?

You can guess or get the meaning of the unknown words from the words that are around it and from the topic of the paragraph.

Question 1

1. The word “**cyber world**” in paragraph 3 is closest in meaning to:

- A. world in games**
- B. world on the Internet**
- C. world in the future**

Take a look at the sentence that has the word “cyber world”:

Maybe, but not everyone thinks the cyber world will replace the real world.

It will be easy if you know that “cyber” means something related to the Internet, like “cyberspace” and “cybercafé”.

=> **cyber world = world on the Internet**

In case you don’t know about “cyber”, from the sentence, you can understand that “the cyber world” is something that has the same functions or even more functions than “the real world”.

Also, the topic of this text is about communication => “cyber world” is a world that allows people to communicate.

Before using the word “cyber world”, the writer mentions “holograph” – a video conference technology. You know that a video conference may use the Internet to connect people.

=> **cyber world = world on the Internet.**

Question 2

The phrase “**enjoy their company**” in paragraph 3 can be replaced by:

- A. enjoy listening to their stories**

B. enjoy talking about work

C. enjoy being with them

Take a look at the sentence that has this phrase:

I prefer to chat with my friends over a cup of tea and enjoy their company.

And the information before this phrase:

...not everyone thinks the cyber world will replace the real world.

(1) “chat with friends over a cup of tea” => meet friends face to face and have some drinks together.

(2) you can understand that the writer doesn’t think the cyber world will replace the real world => the writer prefers to meet face to face.

(1, 2) => “enjoy their company” means something related to “meeting face to face” => **enjoy being with friends**

Note: don’t look at the word ‘company’ and think that the phrase means something related to work place.

OTHER EXAMPLES

Tim is a boy of few words, unlike his talkative sister.

What does “talkative” mean?

=> The sentence tells you that Tim is unlike his talkative sister.

=> You can guess that “talkative” means the opposite of “of few words”.

=> talkative = many words = talks a lot

The drought has lasted for 5 months so the land is becoming arid.

What does “arid” mean?

=> drought = no rain => the land is dry

=> drought lasted for 5 months => the land is probably very dry

=> arid = very dry

Telepathy is the ability to communicate information using your mind. Thoughts and feelings are (A) **transmitted** from one mind to another without using common ways of communication like words or body language. Telepathy can be the ability to read other people's thoughts or even affect someone's mind. It is more likely to happen between people who have a close relationship. Twins often say that they can (B) **sense** each other's feelings no matter what the distance between them. However, it is possible for a person to have this means of communication with anyone, or even with animals. There are some common reasons why someone becomes (C) **telepathic**. For example, there are people who are simply born with the ability. These people talk about seeing spirits. But they often (D) **suppress** this ability as children and often lose it as adults. Besides, a life-changing event, for example a really sad or happy moment, may make them become telepathic. A near-death experience or a serious accident can also (E) **awaken** this ability.
