

## Disability Disclosure in College

You have the **right** to keep information about your disability **confidential**. However, if you want accommodations in college, you will need to inform **Disability Services** about your disability and provide any required documentation. The best way to provide documentation is by keeping important records in a **portfolio**. You can choose to **disclose your disability** at any time, but it is best to do this as soon as you know you will need **accommodations** so that you have time to make sure you have all of the needed **documentation**. After you disclose your disability, you need to meet with your professors to discuss how the accommodation you need will be provided in each of your classes in order to have **equal access**.

### Definitions

\_\_\_\_\_ Protects students from discrimination and makes sure they have the supports and accommodations they qualify for so that they have equal access

\_\_\_\_\_ A collection of documents or projects that represent a person's skills or accomplishments.

\_\_\_\_\_ Private

\_\_\_\_\_ A change made to the way an assignment is completed or how an environment is accessed in order to provide support to a student

\_\_\_\_\_ Legal protections that cannot be taken away

\_\_\_\_\_ The right to have the same opportunities

\_\_\_\_\_ When a person tells someone that they have a disability and describes how it impacts them
