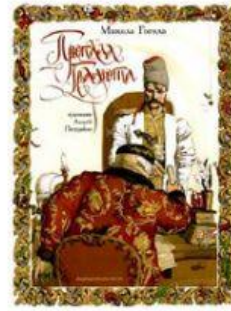
1. Read about Mykhola Gogol and answer the questions.

Mykola Gogol was born in Sorochyntsi, Poltava region in 1809. One of his great grandfathers was Ostap Gogol, a Ukrainian Hetman. In 1828 he went to St. Petersburg where he began writing his famous stories about Ukraine. He became a master of the short story and a classic of Russian literature. His stories include Christmas Eve, Taras Bulba, Viy and Dead Souls.
