Future tense - Will

This week, we are going to focus on what will happen in the future. When talking about the future, use the future with **will** to talk about an event in the future that you have just decided to do, for predictions and for promises.

This is an example of the description of a job in the future. Read the following:

Now, teachers are humans who are in the classroom, but **in the future** teachers **will** be replaced by robots.

Being a teacher **will** be **better in the future** because human teachers **will** have time to prepare lessons while the robots teach children.

Many people think that robots will be better because they **will** not get tired like human teachers. Robots **will** work all day and will not need to sleep. Robots **will** not need holidays, so schools **will** be open for longer.

Now, study the information below. Compare how a soldier in the present will be different in the future.

	Now (present)	Future (after)
Equipment	In danger, no armour.	Armour to protect their bodies.
Helmet	Combat helmet, face exposed	Strong full-face military helmet
Glasses	No glasses.	Very strong plastic glasses to protect their eyes.
Torches	No torch, can't see in the dark.	Helmets with built in torches to see at night. Helmet with night vision.
