Read about the different types of festival below. Then answer the questions that follow.

There are many different kinds of festivals around the world. One popular and interesting festival celebrated in Thailand is the Songkran. It takes place during the Traditional Thai New Year for 3 days, from 13th to 15th April. During the festival, the Thais used water to splash each other. They believe that the water can wash away their sins and bad luck.



Another interesting festival is the Lantern festival. The festival comes from China. It is celebrated on the 15th day of the Chinese lunar month. In 2018, it was celebrated on 2nd March. Chinese make colourful lanterns to appreciate the bright full moon which marks the end of the Chinese New Year celebration.

In Japan, the Japanese celebrate the Gion festival. It is the most famous Festival that takes place in Kyoto. It begins with a ceremony of welcoming and returning the spirit through a mikoshi parade. Mikoshi are portable shrines in which the divine spirits are carried. It normally takes place on the 17th and 24th July.





In India, a festival called Holi is celebrated every year particularly in March. Each year, the Indians come together to throw coloured powder on each other. It is mostly celebrated on the street with loud music before people retreat to private house parties to eat and continue the celebration. It is also known as the festival of colours.

Another interesting festival is the Gawai Dayak in Malaysia celebrated by the Dayak people. It is celebrated on the 1st June. Men and women wear 'nigepan' a traditional costume for this festival.
