

CELEBRATING EASTER

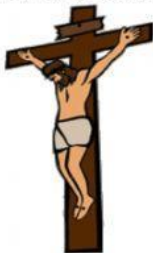
All of these events took place during **Passion Week** or **Holy Week**.

On **Palm Sunday**, many churches celebrate Jesus' Triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Churches are usually decorated with palm branches. Some churches like St. Matthews Anglican Church have Palm Sunday parades.



On **Good Friday**, services are held in most churches. These services are usually solemn because the sermon reflects on **Jesus' death**.



On **Easter Sunday**, services are festive as Christians celebrate **Jesus' resurrection**.
