Seattle

Seattle is a major city in the United States and is located about 150 km south of the Canadian border. There are several lakes, a river and many creeks in the city. In fact, over 40% of the city's area is actually water, so traveling via bridges and ferries is common. It is said that, like Rome, Seattle is built on seven hills.

The city is the major economic, cultural, and educational center of the region. It is a major port, busy with container traffic, cruise ships and commercial fishing vessels. In addition to an international airport, Seattle has several universities and colleges in the city, including the University of Washington and a number of medical centers.

Seattle has a strong, eclectic music scene. It is considered the home of grunge music. Jimi Hendrix and many other artists also are from Seattle. The city's symphony orchestra, opera, and ballet companies are well respected and there are about a hundred theater production companies. There are a wide variety of museums and art galleries. **Seattleites** enthusiastically support their professional sports teams, including football, baseball, women's basketball, and soccer.

The Space Needle, built for the 1962 World's Fair, is a well-known icon of the city, often identifying the city in commercials, movies, and television shows (for

example, "Sleepless in Seattle" and "Grey's Anatomy"). The Needle is 184 m high and at 152 m above the ground there is a restaurant which rotates 360 degrees in forty-seven minutes.

There are many interesting places to see and things to do in Seattle, such as a sculpture of a mythological figure living under a bridge which appears to have just grabbed a car (an actual Volkswagen Beetle) from it; and the Experience Music Project which is said to look like a huge, smashed electric guitar. Then there is the glass library, the zoo, the aquarium and many beaches and parks.

Recreational sports and outdoor activities such as running, bicycling, soccer, boating, and golf can be enjoyed almost year-round in Seattle's cool, mild climate. With nearby mountain ranges and the coast providing skiing, hiking, and surfing opportunities, Seattle is a recreation enthusiast's dream.
