7-5 Polite Questions: May I, Could I, Can I (Câu hỏi lịch sự: May I, Could I, Can I)

Polite Question (Câu hỏi lịch sự)	Possible Answers (Câu trả lời lịch sự)	
(a) May I please borrow your pen?	Yes. Yes. Of course.	People use may I, could I,* and can I to ask polite questions.
(b) Could I please borrow your pen?	Yes. Certainly. Of course.	The questions ask for someone's permission or agreement.
(c) Can I please borrow your pen?	Certainly. Sure. (informal) Okay. (informal)	Examples (a), (b), and (c) have basically the same meaning.

	<p>Uh-huh (<i>meaning "yes"</i>) I'm sorry, but I need to use it myself.</p>		<p>NOTE: can I is less formal than may I and could I. 

7-6 Polite Questions: *Would You, Could You, Will You, Can You.* (Câu hỏi lịch sự: *Would You, Could You, Will You, Can You.*)

Polite Question (Câu hỏi lịch sự)	Possible Answers (Câu trả lời lịch sự)	
(a) Would you please open the door?	Yes. Yes. Of course.	People use would you, could you, will you, and can you to ask polite questions. The questions ask for someone's help or cooperation.
(b) Could you please open the door?	Certainly. I'd be happy to. Of course. I'd be glad to.	Examples (a), (b), (c), and (d) have basically the same meaning.
(c) Will you please open the door?	Sure. (informal) Okay. (informal)	<i>Would</i> and <i>could</i> are generally considered more polite than <i>will</i> and <i>can</i> .
(d) Can you please open the door?	Uh-huh. (meaning "yes") I'm sorry. I'd like to help, but my hands are full.	<i>Ta sử dụng would you, could you, will you, và can you để đặt những câu hỏi lịch sự.</i> Các câu hỏi nhờ giúp đỡ hoặc yêu cầu hợp tác của ai đó. <i>Các ví dụ (a), (b), (c) và (d) về cơ bản có cùng nghĩa.</i> <i>Would và could thường lịch sự hơn will và can.</i>
		NOTE: <i>May</i> is NOT used when <i>you</i> is the subject of a polite question.
