We add -s  
run - runs eat - eats

Add -es when the verb ends in -ss -sh -ch -x -z or -o  
fix - fixes go - goes  
wash - washes

When the verb ends in consonant + y  
cry - cries study - studies dry - dries tidy - tidies fly - flies copy - copies
