

COUNTABLE and UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Countable nouns

- Things we can count:
ONE orange, TWO oranges, THREE oranges
- They have SINGULAR and PLURAL forms:
There is a tomato in the fridge.
There are some tomatoes in the fridge

Uncountable nouns

- Things we canNOT count:
milk – sugar – rice – meat – honey – butter
- They are ONLY SINGULAR
