15	The word <i>hurricane</i> comes from the Spanish word <i>huracán</i> , / which originates from the name of a Mayan god.
16	In the Mayan creation myth, Huracán is the weather god of wind, storm, and fire, / and he is one of the three gods who created humans.
17	However, the first humans angered the gods, so Huracán caused a great flood.
18	The first Spanish contact with the Mayan civilization was in 1517.
19	Spanish explorers who were passing through the Caribbean / experienced a hurricane and picked up the word for it from the people in the area*.
20	In English, one of the early uses of hurricane was in a play by Shakespeare in 1608.

	<hamburger>
21	The word <i>hamburger</i> originally comes from Hamburg, / Germany's second-largest city.
22	<i>Hamburger</i> means "people or things from Hamburg" in German.
23	The origin of the first hamburger is not clear.
24	However, it is believed / that the hamburger was invented in a small town in Texas, USA, sometime between 1885 and 1904.
25	A cook placed a Hamburg-style steak* between two slices of bread, / and people started to call such food a hamburger.
